Limits of Confidentiality

All information shared during counseling is **strictly confidential**. There are, however, limits to confidentiality which counselors are legally bound to report. These include: 1) Any suspected child or elder abuse and/or neglect including physical, sexual, emotional or mental abuse; 2) discussion of suicide or homicidal thoughts with intent to inflict physical harm to self or others; 3) subpoena for court records and 4) threats to national security or disclosure of known terrorist plots client has means to complete.
